
In Tabrani there is a narration of a Hadeeth Qudsi wherein Allah Ta'alaa says:

Ayah 19, Surah 42

Allah is Subtle with His servants; He gives provisions to whom He wills. And He is the Powerful, the Exalted in Might.

Ayah 38 : And those who have responded to their Master and established prayer and whose affair is [determined by] consultation among themselves, and from what We have provided them, they spend.

The above are some of the great attributes of the Sahabah mentioned in the Quran.

<u>Those who respond to their Master</u>, in reference to Abu Bakr R.A. specifically and generally to all the rest of the Sahabah. The story of Abu Dahdah R.A.

Abu Dahda (may Allah have mercy on him) was one of those people who found an opportunity to respond to Allah and HIS Rasulullah Sallallahu alaihi wasallam and win what is greater than the heavens and the earth.

There was a companion of the Rasulullah (Sallallahu alaihi wasallam) who planted his garden next to the property of an orphan. The orphan claimed that a specific palm tree was on his property and therefore belonged to him.

The companion rejected the claim,

So the orphan went to the Rasulullah (Sallallahu alaihi wasallam) to complain.

The Messenger of Allah (sallAllahu alayhi wasallam) measured the two gardens and found that the palm tree did indeed belong to the companion.

The orphan began crying.

Seeing this, the Prophet (sallAllahu alayhi wasallam) asked the companion, "Would you give him the palm tree and for you is a palm tree in Jannah?"

However, the Sahabi did not agree.

But someone else saw the opportunity – Abu Dahdah (radiAllahu anhu).

He went to the Rasulullah (Sallallahu alaihi wasallam) and asked, "Ya RasulAllah, if I buy the tree from him and give it to the orphan shall I have that tree in Jannah?"

The Messenger of Allah (sallAllahu alayhi wasallam) replied, "Yes."

Abu Dahdah (radi Allahu anhu) had chased after the companion and asked,

"Would you sell that tree to me for my entire garden?" (Abu Dahda had a garden of 600 trees)

The companion answered, "Take it, for there is no good in a tree that was complained to the Prophet about."


Immediately, Abu Dahda (radi Allahu anhu) went home and found his wife and children playing in the garden. "Leave the garden!" shouted Abu Dahda.

SURAH AZ-ZUKHRUF



Ayah 13/14: That you may settle yourselves upon their backs and then remember the favor of your Lord when you have settled upon them and say. "Exalted is He who has subjected this to us, and we could not have [otherwise] subdued it.

And lo! unto our Lord we surely are returning.

These verses should be recited whenever we mount our cars, vehicles or modes of transport. Because it is Only Allah who has made them subservient to us.

In addition do the following: Read:

- Bismillah followed by Surah Al kaafiroon (QUL YAA AYYUAHL KAAFIROON...)
- BISMILLAH again followed by Surah An Nasr. (ITHAA JAA' A NASRULLAHI WAL..)

- BISMILLAH followed by Surah IKHLASS (QUL HUWALLAHU AHAD..)
- Bismillah again followed by Surah Al-Falaq (QUL A'UTHU BIRABBIL FALAQ..)
- Bismillah followed by Surah An-Naas (QUL A'UTHU BIRABBINNAAS..)
- Bismillah finally again.

Jubayr bin Mut'im R.A. narrates that Rasulullah Sallallahu alaihi wasallam once said to me whenever you undertake a journey, would you not like to be the most well off (in terms of wealth and provision) and best in appearance (i.e you are overcome with fatigue and exhaustion) compared to the rest of our fellow travellers?

Jubayr R.A said "of course do tell me, may my parents be sacrificed for you." Rasulullah Sallallahu alaihi wasallam then said "read the following 5 Surahs beginning each surah with بسنم اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيم and after completing the 5 surahs, read بسنم اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيم again.the Surahs are ، (قُلْ يَا أَيُّهَا الْكَافِرُونَ) ، وَ (إِذَا جَاءَ نَصْرُ اللَّهِ وَالْفَتْحُ) ، و (قُلْ أَعُوذُ بِرَبِّ النَّاسِ) و (قُلْ أَعُوذُ بِرَبِّ النَّاسِ)

Previously, despite being wealth, whenever I undertook a journey, I would always run short of provisions and m appearance would be the most unkempt. However, since Rasulullah Sallallahu alaihi wasallam taught me to recite these Surahs, I now am the best of them in terms of appearance as well as provisions.
